Knox II, and the Knox family and Jeffrey Gundlach, whose names now grace this museum—make gifts that look both backward and forward, embracing diverse histories and bold aspirations for the future. Their support has been grounded in a deep belief in the museum’s legacy of extraordinary achievement and the limitless possibilities that lie ahead of us. Private philanthropy is a manifestation of an individual’s vision and their achievements in life, and it is also an act of courage. To believe in and to contribute to something that is not one’s own, something that is communal and larger than any individual life, is a cornerstone of our democracy. Just like artists who are courageous in their acts of creation, individuals and families who

believe in, and through their generosity catalyze, the transformative power of art are cultural trailblazers, the builders of tomorrow’s society.

Philanthropy comes in many forms. Time, talent, and treasure are vital factors that contribute to Buffalo AKG Art Museum’s success and they have a profound impact on all of our activities. **Through your membership commitment, with your gift to this museum of both monetary support and your time and attention, you belong to an extraordinary community that collectively ensures that people from all walks of life can connect with and embrace the transformative power of art.** On behalf of our staff and the hundreds of thousands of people who visit the Buffalo AKG each year, thank you for believing in art’s capacity to inspire courage, and thank you for helping us uplift the human spirit through dialogue, learning, respect for diverse points of view, and meaningful encounters with the products of human creativity. Art brings people together and your generosity as members empowers us to be a place of convergence.

The exhibitions we presented in the 2024–2025 fiscal year achieved broad national and international attention. *Marisol: A Retrospective*, a survey of the pioneering Venezuelan-American artist’s career, was a watershed moment in the history of the Buffalo AKG because it enabled us to share with the world, after years of research, her extraordinary bequest of hundreds of works of art. The exhibition, which now

embarks on a three-venue European tour, was the subject of more than forty glowing reviews throughout its American run. The year also featured the following exhibitions: *Hi-Vis*, a survey celebrating the artists who have worked with our Public Art Initiative during its first ten years, 2014–2024; *Steina: Playback*, the first solo exhibition in more than a decade that explored the multifaceted career of this pioneering Icelandic media artist; *Electric Op*, a survey of the rich relationship between Op art and contemporary digital and media art, which was also presented at the Musée d’arts de Nantes in France; and *Made at the Museum*, an exhibition in the AKG’s M&T Bank Gallery that celebrated fifty years of accessible programming for visitors with disabilities and their caregivers.

In 2024–2025, we also presented two exhibitions showcasing artworks that the Buffalo AKG recently received as gifts: *Adam Fuss: Visual Resonance*, the artist’s first solo museum presentation in more than a decade, drawn largely from a significant collection of works generously donated to the Buffalo AKG by Deborah Ronnen; and the aptly titled *Quiet Elegance: A Remarkable Bequest*, which comprised several significant artworks gifted to the museum by an anonymous donor. Both exhibitions are manifestations of the enduring power of thoughtful philanthropy.

The rich tapestry of the Buffalo AKG’s exhibitions, programs, and collecting activities in 2024–2025 is a testament to the museum’s dedication to artists and their groundbreaking work and also to the many histories that our collection

and exhibition program embody. Every day the staff of the Buffalo AKG works tirelessly to carry forth into the future the baton that has been passed down for nearly six generations. From humble beginnings in 1862, when we had no collection and operated in a rental space in downtown Buffalo, we have grown over the past 163 years into a globally recognized leader among museums of modern and contemporary art. On behalf of the staff, the Board, our visitors, and the museum itself, thank you for supporting our mission.
